Seasonal Pool Care Calendar

From spring opening to winter close — what to do, when, and when it pays to call a pro.



Care for your pool with open eyes — then get matched, free, with licensed, insured pool service pros near you. You compare quotes and choose who to hire.

Spring — open and balance

- Remove and clean the cover; reconnect equipment
- Top up the water and start the pump
- Test and rebalance the water before anyone swims
- Inspect for winter damage to tile, plaster, and equipment

Summer — maintain and protect

- 1 Keep the weekly routine: skim, brush, vacuum, test, balance.
- 2 Watch chlorine in heat and heavy use — it gets used up faster.
- 3 Check the filter pressure and clean or backwash as needed.
- 4 Keep up every safety layer — this is peak swim season.



Fall — repair and prepare

- Fix what the season wore out before it gets cold
- Plan resurfacing or equipment work in the off-season
- Keep cleaning as leaves fall to protect the water

Winter — close and protect

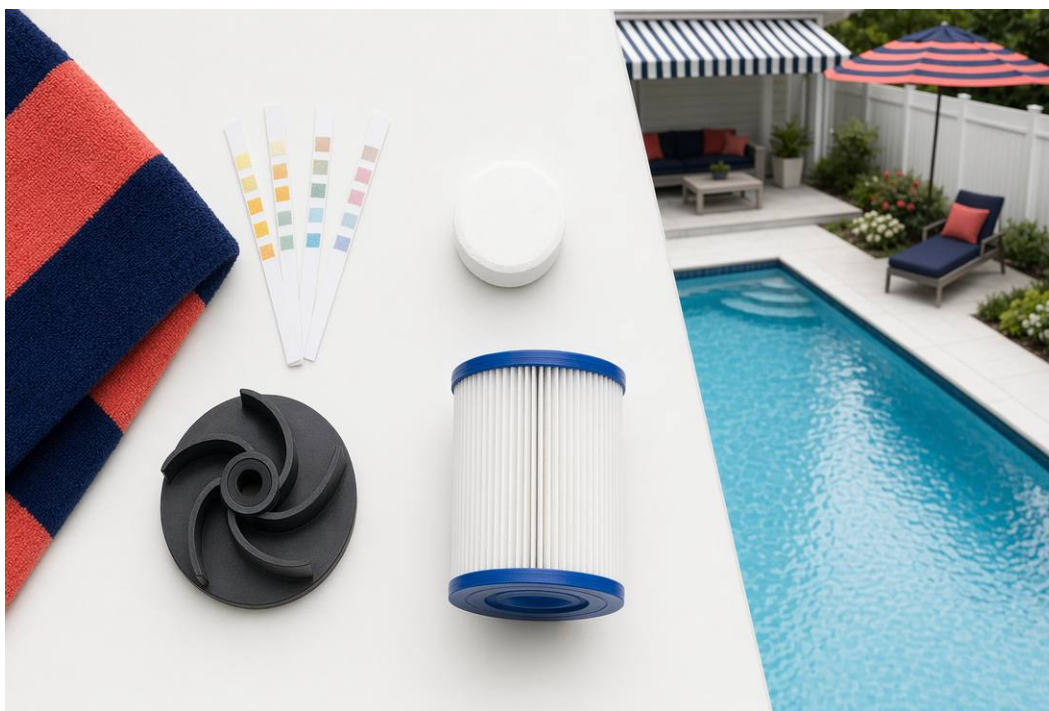
- 1 Balance the water, then lower it as your closing method requires.
- 2 Blow out and plug the lines so they can't freeze and crack.
- 3 Add winterizing chemicals and store equipment properly.
- 4 Fit a clean, secure cover that's rated for safety.



When to call a pro

Openings, closings, and equipment work are easy to get wrong, and a freeze crack is expensive. If you're unsure, get matched, free, with a licensed pool pro near you. You compare quotes and choose who to hire.
